## Good Afternoon:

I am writing as we are at a time of significant change in the Boy Scouts of America. To provide a safe space for all our scouts, and to support the new Family Scouting program, as well the inclusion of young women in Boy Scouts in 2019, the BSA has introduced new Youth Protection Training. This training is more in-depth than the previous YPT and address many of the questions we have received about procedural changes to leadership, safety, and other concerns regarding the recent changes to BSA programs. All registered adult leaders must complete the training by October 1st, 2018 per national guidelines, even if the adult has taken the former YPT in the past 2 years.
