What Scouting is Not

A vibrant Scouting program relies on active participation. The BSA is a dynamic organization that challenges youth to grow on many levels and requires a sincere commitment of time, energy and family support. It does not function as well when families are not present or supportive. The Cub Scouts is not a "babysitting" service—we hope our parents as well as our youth will be as engaged and active as their circumstances permit. Cub and Webelos Scout activities need parents involved for the boys' safety and support.

Keep in mind that ALL Tiger Cub activities require a parent or guardian present.

Boy Scouts of America History

The Story of a Good Turn,

Boy Scout Handbook, Tenth Edition, Chapter 26, Boy Scouts of America

How good must a Good Turn be to be good? The answer is best given by telling you the story of how Scouting came to America. It shows that it isn't the size of a Good Turn that counts. What is important is the spirit with which a Scout does a Good Turn. "Do a Good Turn Daily" is the Scout Slogan.

One Day in 1909 in London, England, an American visitor, William D. Boyce, lost his way in a dense fog. He stopped under a street lamp and tried to figure out where he was. A boy approached him and asked if he could be of help. "You certainly can," said Boyce. He told the boy that he wanted to find a certain business office in the center of the city. "I'll take you there," said the boy. When they got to the destination, Mr. Boyce reached into his pocket for a tip. But the boy stopped him. "No thank you, sir. I am a Scout. I won't take anything for helping." "A Scout? And what might that be?" asked Boyce. The boy told the American about himself and his brother Scouts. Boyce became very interested. After finishing his errand, he had the boy take him to the British Scouting office. At the office, Boyce met Lord Robert Baden-Powell, the famous British general who had founded the Scouting movement in Great Britain. Boyce was so impressed with what he learned that he decided to bring Scouting home with him.

On February 8, 1910, Boyce and a group of outstanding leaders founded the Boy Scouts of America. From that day forth, Scouts have celebrated February 8 as the birthday of Scouting in the United States.

What happened to the boy who helped Mr. Boyce find his way in the fog? No one knows. He had neither asked for money nor given his name, but he will never be forgotten. His Good Turn helped bring the Scouting movement to our country. In the British Scout Training Center at Gilwell Park, England, Scouts from the United States erected a statue of an American buffalo in honor of this unknown Scout. *One* Good Turn to *one* man became a Good Turn to millions of American boys. Such is the power of a Good Turn.

In 2010, the Boy Scouts of America celebrated its Centennial with special events, ceremonies and commemorative rank badges. 2012 marked another milestone in BSA history as it was the 100th anniversary of the Eagle Scout rank.

Cub Scouts & Webelos History

Back in England, young boys were eager to become Boy Scouts. In 1914, Baden-Powell began implementing a program for even younger boys that was based on Rudyard Kipling's *Jungle Book*. The Wolf Cub program began in 1916, and since that time, Wolf Cubbing spread to other European countries with very little change.

In America, hundreds of Cub Scout-age boys and their families were clamoring for a program of their own. As early as 1920, Scout executives at the first national training conference discussed the needs of younger boys. The BSA, however, felt it wise to postpone any action until there was more objective evidence.

By 1929, a new Cubbing program (it wasn't called "Cub Scouting" until several years later) was taking shape and was introduced as a demonstration project in a limited number of communities. Its structure was similar to today's Cub Scouting, except that Dens were led by Boy Scout Den chiefs. The plan included a neighborhood mothers' committee to encourage Cubs and Den chiefs.

In 1930, Cub Scouting was formally launched, with 5,102 boys registered at the end of that first year. By 1933 the time had come to promote Cub Scouting throughout the country as a part of Scouting. All experimental restrictions were removed, and the first national director of Cub Scouting was appointed.

Den Mother registration was optional for the first few years. By June 1938, 1,100 Den Mothers had registered and soon became an important part of Cub Scouting.

The first Dens met weekly at a member's home, where boys played games and enjoyed crafts and ceremonies. The Pack met weekly or semimonthly for games, Den competitions, awards, stunts, and other activities. Cubs advanced from Bobcat (for all new members) to Wolf (age 9), Bear (age 10), and Lion (age 11) and joined a Boy Scout troop at age 12.

In 1949, the age requirement was lowered to between 8 and 10 for Cub Scouts. In 1982, Tiger Cubs was started based on shared leadership of boyadult partner teams and the school year calendar. In 1986, Cub Scouts could register as second-grade boys.

A strong influence from Kipling's Jungle Book remains today. The terms "Law of the Pack," "Akela," "Wolf Cub," "grand howl," "Den," and "Pack" all come from the Jungle Book. At the same time, the Gold and Silver Arrow Points, Webelos emblem, and Arrow of Light emblem are taken from our American Indian heritage.

Cub Scouts & Webelos History, (cont'd)

In the spring of 1954, the Webelos Den was created for 10½ year olds who had earned the Lion Rank. It was thought that this would keep the interest of the older boys and smooth the transition into Boy Scouts. They utilized the newly published Lion-Webelos handbook.

In 1967, the Lion rank was eliminated and was replaced with the Webelos rank, which retained the "Arrow of Light"-style badge design of the former Webelos Award and consisted of a new set of achievements and experiences to better prepare older boys for Boy Scouting. The Webelos colors and activity badges were also introduced at this time, originally numbering 15. Between 1967 and 1972, the Cub Scout uniform only displayed two diamond shaped patches, Wolf and Bear, side by side, with the Webelos rank badge on the pocket flap.

In late 1971 or early 1972, the old Webelos rank badge was slightly altered and was renamed to the Arrow of Light, with a significant change in the requirements. In 1977, a new diamond-shaped Webelos rank badge was introduced.

When the grade-based rank system was phased in in 1986, the age for beginning Tiger Cubs was lowered to 1st grade, and Webelos Scouts became a two year program aimed at 4th and 5th graders. Five new activity badges were added to the Webelos Scout Book in 1987, and the two-year Webelos Scout program became official in 1988.

In 2001, the current oval Webelos rank badge was introduced. This badge may be worn either on the blue uniform in place of the rank badge diamond, or on the tan uniform like a Boy Scout rank badge.

BSA & Pack Structure

The BSA has its headquarters in Irving, TX and this layer of the organization is known as the *National Council*.

Underneath the National Council, the BSA is organized into <u>Regions.</u> We belong to the *Northeast Region*.

Each Region is organized into geographical <u>Areas</u> and then <u>Councils</u>. Ours is the *Hudson Valley Council*.

The Hudson Valley Council has 4 geographically-based <u>Districts</u>. Pack 3040 belongs to the <u>Dutchess District</u>.

A <u>Chartered Organization</u> sponsors and actually "owns" each individual BSA unit. Our chartered organization is the Knights of Columbus, Wappingers Falls.

The <u>Unit Committee</u> is comprised of adult volunteers who administer and supervise the BSA program at the unit level under the auspices of the Chartered Organization.

And last but not least, our <u>Unit</u> is called <u>Pack 3040</u>, though we've been around since before the advent of four-digit numbers and have grown used to calling ourselves just "Pack 40."

In terms of overseeing Pack 3040, our Pack committee is led by a *Committee Chair*. The day-to-day supervision of Pack 3040 is under the leadership of an adult volunteer known as a *Cubmaster*. Other adult volunteers run the Dens that the boys belong to and also help run the Pack—they are called *Den Leaders* at the Tiger, Wolf and Bear levels and *Patrol Leaders* for Webelos.

At the youth level, a *Den Chief* might be assigned to one or more Dens. These are Boy Scouts from a local Troop who help the Den/Patrol Leaders run their meetings and set a good example for our Scouts.

Each Den should elect a *Denner*; one of the Scouts in the Den that serves on a temporary basis (typically a month) and who helps the Den or Patrol Leader.

Other adult positions in the Pack leadership include: Assistant Cubmaster, Committee Members and Chairs, Treasurer, Pack Trainer, Popcorn Kernel (for our popcorn fundraiser)

The Pack can always use help to fill vacant positions, so please consider joining our team of volunteers.

Cub Scout Program

Unlike Boy Scouts where boys can be in a patrol with other boys who might vary in age from 11 to 17, the Cub Scout program keeps boys of the same age and/or school grade level together.

Den Structure (first 3 years of Cub Scouts)

- Tiger Cubs: boys who are 7 years old or in first grade
- Wolf: boys who are 8 years old or in second grade
- Bear: boys who are 9 years old or in third grade

Patrol Structure (final 2 years of Cub Scouts)

- First-Year Webelos; boys who are 10 years old or in fourth grade
- Second-Year Webelos; boys who are 11 years old or in fifth grade

The Arrow of Light is the highest achievement in Cub Scouting, similar to the Eagle Scout rank in Boy Scouts. To earn this award, a Webelos Scout must earn activity badges, complete tenure and faith requirements, go camping and show that he is ready to become a Boy Scout.

Eligibility for Cub Scouts & Arrow of Light

A boy can join Cub Scouts anytime as long as he meets the age and/or grade requirements. All Cub Scouts, including new Webelos, must earn their Bobcat Badge first, showing that they understand the principles of Cub Scouting. To earn the Arrow of Light, a Cub Scout typically must complete both Webelos years in order to satisfy the tenure requirements.

Advancement & Belt Loops

The first rank that all Cub Scouts (including new Webelos) must earn is their <u>Bobcat Badge.</u>

After this, Cub Scouts earn the rank for their appropriate Den year; i.e., <u>Tiger, Wolf</u> and <u>Bear</u>, while Webelos start working on their <u>Webelos Badge</u>. If a boy joins Cub Scouting after the Tiger Cub year (7 years old/first grade) he would skip the previous years' badge(s) and simply work on whatever rank is appropriate for his age/grade level. For example, if a boy were to join in his Bear year, he would bypass the Tiger and Wolf badges and just work on his Bear. Likewise, a new Webelos Scout must earn Bobcat, but would not complete Tiger, Wolf and/or Bear.



Tiger Cubs are given the "<u>Tiger Cub Immediate Recognition Emblem</u>" by the Pack. This is attached to the button on the right pocket flap. As Tigers complete their Badge requirements, they are given different colored beads by their Den leader; as these are earned, they should be threaded onto the appropriate thongs that are suspended from the badge.



Similarly, Wolves and Bears use the "Progress Towards Ranks Emblem," also worn on the right pocket button (it replaces the Tiger Cub Emblem.) For every 3 achievements a Wolf Scout completes, he is given a gold bead by his Den Leader. Likewise, Bears earn a red bead for every 3 achievements; these are attached to a separate thong. This Emblem is worn for both the Wolf and Bear years but should be retired when the boy becomes a Webelos Scout.

During their second year and after completing their Webelos Badge plus other requirements, a Webelos Scout may earn his Arrow of Light. This is Cub Scouting's highest rank. The Arrow of Light is usually presented at the Blue & Gold Banquet; this is also when the second-year Webelos symbolically "cross over" to a Boy Scout troop of their choice, formally ending their relationship with the Pack.



Belt Loops & Pins, officially known as the "Cub Scout Academics and Sports Program" are another form of recognition and are displayed on the Official Blue Web Belt. Currently Cub Scouts and Webelos can earn Belt Loops and/or Pins in over 50 subjects, ranging from Archery to Wildlife Conservation. They are grouped into two main categories, Academics, and Sports, and cover a wide variety of disciplines and activities. Belt Loops & Pins are typically awarded at Pack Meetings.

Types of Pack Gatherings

Pack Meeting (entire Pack of 60+ Scouts)

Typically the last Friday of the month at Myers Corners Elementary School in Cafetorium 1 at 156 Myers Corners Road, Wappingers Falls, NY 12590 Gathering starts at 7pm; meeting starts at 7:15

Den or Patrol Meeting (6-8 Scouts)

Various times and venues; usually held twice a month

PackCommittee Meeting

Usually the third Friday of the month at 7 pm at Myers Corners Elementary School Library. All parents are welcome!

Campouts

Pack 3040 has an annual campout, usually in late Spring. Webelos can camp independently as a patrol and often have a few campouts a year.

Summer Camp

Offered at three local camps in July and August

Blue & Gold Banquet

This is to celebrate the birthday of Scouting & celebrate our Scouts with the Pack and their families. In Pack 40, this is when our Second-Year Webelos Scouts traditionally transition over to Boy Scouts. Open to family and relatives.

Pinewood Derby

A Pack-wide miniature wooden car race. Scouts make their own cars and awards are presented for the fastest and the best-decorated.

Haunted Harvest Fest

Held at BSA Camps Nooteeming and/or Bullowa, this spooky-themed festival is oriented just for Cub Scouts & Webelos.

Army Hockey Night at West Point

We catch an Army Hockey game every year, usually in January

Eskimo Run

Webelos winter sled rally & skills competition in February

I-84 Coffee Fundraiser

In the fall and/or spring, the Pack serves free coffee and pastries at a rest stop on Interstate 84 in the hopes of attracting donations.

Types of Pack Gatherings, (cont'd)

Popcorn Fundraiser

Our Pack sells BSA popcorn to raise funds, both to friends and relatives and at the Poughkeepsie Galleria.

Carwash Fundraiser

Typically in the summer and held at a local Stewart's store, this is a wet fun(draiser)!

Service Projects

Pack 3040 does a variety of service projects each year to help our community, Myers Corner Elementary School, where we hold our meetings, and with our Chartering Organization, the Knights of Columbus.

Caroling for Seniors

In mid-December, the Pack travels to Avalon Assisted Living and Wellness Center in Wappingers Falls to sing carols for Senior Citizens.

Scouting for Food

BSA's annual box and can drive to help those who can't afford enough food.

Samuel Morse Home Service Project

We do various maintenance projects for the Samuel Morse Home which hosts our Pinewood Derby.

Rail Trail Service Project





Dues & Registration

Pack 40 offers a year-round program. We collect annual dues and registration fees at September and October's Pack Meetings.

If a Scout joins later in the year, the amount is pro-rated appropriately. Our dues and fees include BSA registration and insurance, insignia, supplies and other program costs. Through fundraising, we try to keep the amount as low as possible to make Scouting accessible to all.

Currently, our annual dues and registration fees are set at \$65. If you want a subscription to Boy's Life Magazine (recommended, not required), the cost is only \$12 more. Keep in mind the dues and registration fee does not include uniforms, certain campout and food costs, summer camp, etc. This year, the Pack was able to offset the cost of the Blue and Gold Banquet and the Annual Campout at Sharpe Reservation for our registered youth.

Adult volunteer leaders' BSA registration fees as well as costs associated with certain types of training are covered completely by the Pack.

Fundraising

We are an active Pack and have aggressive fundraising programs but are always open to new ideas. Currently, our fundraising includes selling BSA/Land's End popcorn, the I-84 Coffee Break, and our annual Car Wash fundraiser. Please support these programs in any way you can. Frequently Asked Questions (F.A.Q)

Q. Are Cub Scouts the same as Boy Scouts?

A. Cub Scouting is a program of the Boy Scouts of America—so in that sense, Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts are both members of the same organization. However, they are entirely different programs: Cub Scouting is a family-oriented program designed specifically to address the needs of younger boys.

Q. How often do Cub Scouts meet?

A. Scouts in Pack 40 typically meet in their Dens or Patrols twice a month plus a Pack meeting is held for all Scouts and their families once a month. Beyond that, it depends on the Den / Patrol and Pack: a Den / Patrol may hold a special activity, such as a service project or visit to a local museum in place of one of the weekly meetings or in addition to the weekly meetings. Likewise, a Pack may conduct a special event such as a Blue & Gold banquet as an additional event, rather than a substitute for its monthly pack meeting.

Q. I'm concerned about the safety of my child. How does the BSA protect its youth?

A. Extensive training for one thing—the safety of our youth is BSA's highest concern. All its volunteers must undergo vigorous training before they are allowed to lead units. Whenever travel is involved, a tour permit must be filed and cleared with the local Council. In terms of guarding against predatory behavior, every volunteer must undergo a background check and take Youth Protection Training every 2 years. Checks and balances like "2 Deep Leadership" which requires at least two adults over 21 to be present at all official Scout functions and "No One on One Contact" further protect our youth.

Q. Where can I buy uniforms and insignia?

Q. I see a lot of kids just wearing the Scout shirt with jeans or other pants, is this OK?

A. It's OK, but a full uniform is preferred. Part of the BSA experience is correctly wearing and taking care of a full uniform. For those who face financial hardships, the Pack may be able to help with uniforms; please contact your leader.

Q. Some of my son's friends say Scouting is not "cool" and he feels embarrassed about being a Scout and wearing his uniform to school.

A. Skiing, Rock Wall Climbing, Athletics, Lifesaving Skills, Camping, Archery, Aquatics, BB Gun Shooting, Boating and Hiking are just some of the "uncool" things your son can do proudly as a Cub Scout. And a quick look at notable Americans who earned the rank of Eagle might help you convince your son that Scouting can be a foundation for great accomplishments. The sky is literally the limit—or perhaps beyond!
