Troop 195 Buddy / Tent Policy

All boys must follow the buddy system when camping, hiking, going place to place, The Buddy system is grouping three or more together for safety, (No less than 3) No One on One – this applies to adults and to the boys.

Tent sleeping – No less than three to a tent, No One on One. The age difference cannot be greater than one year apart.

Example: a 12 year old, a 13 year old and a 14 year old can sleep in the same tent and buddy up together, however a 12 year old, a 14 year old and a 16 year old may not sleep in the same tent or buddy up.

If an older boy is over one year apart in age or older he can work with the new younger boys on rank requirements and scout crafts, but would not be allowed to sleep in the same tent.

The rules are in place for the safety of all youths, There are times that the boys (patrols) are out of sight of an adult. This troop policy protects the boys and adults.
